A Colorful History - A National Leader
100 Years Department of Minnesota VFW

In 1973, joined Sgt. John Rice VFW Post 6316 in Blaine, Minnesota (There's a story with that as well). Then Post Commander, Harold Wolff signed me up and became my Mentor. Harold taught me a lot about the Veterans of Foreign Wars. I carry much of that teaching with me today.

In 1977, I applied for a job at the VFW Claims Office. Jerry Stokke got that job. At the same time, there was an opening for the Assistant Adjutant-Quartermaster. That job was offered to me and I accepted. I served in that position for twenty-one years and learned my job from two of the Greatest Adjutant-Quartermasters in the Country - John O'Neill Jr. and Lester Orton.

In 1998, I sought and was elected State Quartermaster. A

year later, State Commander Dave Adams appointed me State Adjutant and I 'officially' became the State Headquarters Office Manager.

During the almost forty years that I worked for the Department of Minnesota VFW, we were a National Leader in:

- Membership with forty (40) years of Continuous Growth reaching 85,988 in 1991 and an All-American State Commander every one of those years.
- Buddy Poppies with an All-Time high of 1,246,000 Buddy Poppies distributed in Minnesota. At that time, ALL of Minnesota's Buddy Poppies were assembled here in Minnesota by Disabled Veterans at St. Cloud V.A. Hospital, the Minneapolis Veterans Home and

- Hastings Veterans Home.
- For decades, Minnesota led the Nation in Community Service.
- Other Departments were calling us about our Officer Training School, our various Procedure and Policy Documents and our All-State Post Commander and Quartermaster Point System.
- The National Organization always looked to Minnesota for New and Innovative ways to make the Veterans of Foreign Wars Great.

During those years, the Department had some of its Greatest Leaders. These State Commanders not only made a substantial impact in the direction of the Department,

Statewide Passport Run

Many of you might not know that the VFW supports a motorcycle riding group program called the VFW Riders. Currently in Minnesota we have three Riders groups (Monticello, Cottage Grove, and District 4). Any Post or District can start a Riders Group, and any VFW or Auxiliary member can join any group without being a member of or transferring to the sponsoring Post. I am passionate about the VFW Riders program and encourage anyone with questions to contact me directly. To promote the VFW Riders program, and in celebration of the Department of Minnesota’s 100th Anniversary. The Department of MN VFW Riders are sponsoring a Statewide Passport Run held from May 1 until September 1, 2021.

Posts throughout the state have signed up to be stops on the ride. Each participant registers online and downloads their own passport card and reference sheet. Participants then make their way to the Posts listed on the sheet, visiting the different Posts and communities they serve, and get their passport stamped. Every five

stamps qualify for one entry into the prize drawing to be held at the MN VFW Fall Conference in September 2021. Participants who visit ALL the Posts listed receive and extra entry into the drawing. Registration will open April 1, and the event will begin May 1. Completed cards will be sent to me for verification and drawing entry. The goal is to get out and visit Posts and communities that are outside of your area and gain an appreciation for all the work the VFW has done for communities around the state in the last 100 years.

While one of the objectives of this event is to promote the VFW Riders program and riding motorcycles while participating is strongly encouraged, everyone can participant regardless of vehicle preference. So, get your bike, trike, car, truck, or amphibious personnel carrier running and out on the road to celebrate 100 years of the VFW in Minnesota.

This past year will certainly go down in history as one of the most stressful, painful and restricted years in our life. I have encouraged members to make buddy calls, to reach out to their fellow vets and to support them as they struggle with social isolation, lost jobs, financial struggles, health struggles, anger issues and the inability to even visit their loved ones in nursing homes or hospitals. Not having funerals for closure of the loss of a loved one, martial law type rules and regulation and not having the ability to socialize or get together with friends and family. Slowly things are getting back towards this new normalcy but it may be years before everyone feels

safe again.

We can still help others and have social outings as long as we stay safe and are careful about not spreading this virus to those with compromised immune systems.

Our local VA offered me the Vaccine and I have now completed both shots with only mild discomfort. Many of our family and friends have refused to get the vaccine and that is their right, but it may restrict their ability to travel.

We have all lost loved ones this past year and suicides continue to haunt us. Suicide is an escape from intolerable pain or anguish and with help from professionals or another veteran the hurting individual might take a closer look at the underlying problem and delay or stop them from making that irrational decision.

I have had to work with the families and friends of fatal suicides

The All-American Dashboard is your one-stop shop for reporting the VFW Programs. The dashboard will be populated with up-to-date information on which reports VFW National has received, and is a much more efficient way to track your Post or District progress toward achieving All-American for the membership year. These are the normal All-American Requirements: Buddy Poppy Order, Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen and Veterans & Military Support Donation. These are Additional Entries: Community

Service, National Legislative Service and National Veterans Services.

The Status bar on the Dashboard will be reflected in Yellow as Pending for the level that has not approved your report. The Dashboard will not change to Green as Met until National Programs have approved the report. The Dashboard will remain Red as Unmet until a report is entered.

IMPORTANT!!! All Adjutants must have an account on the National Website. If you are unable to set-up an account, I recommend you contact the Help Desk at 833-839-8387.

and the pain they must endure for the rest of their life is often unbearable. We as VFW members need to reach out more often. Offer classes on suicide prevention like the Eagles Healing Nest and the VA has done and not be afraid of confronting someone if we believe they may be contemplating suicide. They may get angry or question your motives but it also may save their life.

Make sure the suicide/crisis hot line is available at your post and on

your phone: 1-800-273-8255. These are your brothers and sisters. Twenty deaths a day is still too many.

Finally, we must continue to make stronger efforts to quit smoking, reduce our alcohol intake, exercise if possible, lose weight and stay mentally healthy and fit.

We must fight for our deserved compensation from the VA, call or write our elected officials and assist others who need help.

Claims and Service Office Report

NEW AGENT ORANGE PRESUMPTIVE CONDITIONS

March 11, 2021

Many of you may be aware that the National Defense Authorization Act of 2021 (NDAA)(H.R. 6395) added three new presumptive conditions for those veterans who served in areas exposed to herbicides. The specific conditions that have now been added to the list are bladder cancer, hypothyroidism and parkinsonian type disorders.

If a veteran potentially filed of any of these conditions in the past and were denied, there is a possibility to take a new look at those denied claims from before. If a veteran is now diagnosed with any of these conditions and has not filed a claim for service connection, then we urge you to take the necessary steps to start that process now by contacting our office.

With all of that said, and even though they are officially added to the list, the Department of Veterans Affairs is not actively working those claims just yet. There needs to be further guidance from the VA's Office of Field Operations. Currently if a claim is submitted for one of these conditions the VA will simply defer it, and then begin the work on it once they get the green light. We are hopeful that will be soon.

The unfortunate reality regarding these diseases is that many veterans have passed while waiting for Congress to finalize everything with them. Because of this there are now many surviving spouses that are without their loved ones. We encourage any surviving spouse or eligible family member to contact our office for guidance on how to pursue their own claims for benefits,

because of their veteran's passing from one of these conditions.

As the list of conditions continues to grow because of Agent Orange exposure, I would be remised in reminding everyone of other conditions that are already presumed to be due to those herbicides.

- AL AmyloidosisChronic B-Cell Leukemia
- Chloracne (if it presents within one year of exposure to a degree of 10 percent disabling)
- Diabetes Mellitus Type 2
- Hodgkin's Disease
- Ischemic Heart Disease (including Coronary Artery Disease, stable and unstable angina, myocardial infarction, and sudden cardiac death)
- Multiple Myeloma
- Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma
- Parkinson's Disease
- Peripheral Neuropathy, Early Onset (if it presents within one year of exposure to a degree of 10 percent disabling)
- Porphyria Cutanea Tarda (if it presents within one year of exposure to a degree of 10 percent disabling)
- Prostate Cancer
- Respiratory Cancers, including Lung Cancer
- Soft Tissue Sarcomas (other than osteosarcoma, chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's sarcoma, and mesothelioma)

VFW to Deliver 2021 Priority Goals to Congress Virtually

March 10, 2021

WASHINGTON – For the first time in history, leadership from the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) will address Congress virtually for its annual veterans' advocacy hearing.

VFW National Commander Hal Roesch will testify March 18 at 10 a.m. (EDT) before a special joint hearing of the House and Senate Committees on Veterans' Affairs held by video teleconference.

"Now more than ever, Congress needs to hear the voice of our veteran community," Roesch said. "The pandemic has overwhelmed all of us and changed the way we do business. Regardless of the setting or format, the VFW will continue to press for the full support of Congress on our key priorities and look forward to the

discussion on how to best address the issues affecting veterans and their families."

The yearly testimony typically takes place in-person on Capitol Hill, hosting a large contingent of leaders from the VFW and its Auxiliary, as well as other veteran service organizations. However, Congress made the decision to move all of this year's hearings to an online, socially distant format out of pandemic safety concerns.

Roesch is prepared to discuss the VFW's top priorities for 2021. These key legislative priorities include:

- Toxic Exposures and Other Environmental Hazards
- Veteran Economic Issues
- Veteran Claims and Benefits
- Underserved Veteran Populations

VA Fights Back Against Predatory Claims-Assistance Practices

March 4, 2021

WASHINGTON — During National Consumer Protection Week, Feb. 28 - March 6, the Department of Veteran Affairs (VA) is raising public awareness about a tool to protect Veterans and claimants from companies who may be targeting them or their potential benefits.

VA encourages Veterans and their families filing benefits claims to review the department's Accreditation Search Index.

The index provides state-by-state contact information, as well as a downloadable list of Veterans Service Organization (VSO) representatives, attorneys and claims agents who are ready to assist with preparing VA claims in an ethical and lawful manner.

"VA cautions Veterans and claimants of online offers to assist in the preparation of their benefit claims that sound too good to be true," said Acting Under Secretary for Benefits Thomas Murphy. "To help guard against fraud and scams, VA urges all Veterans and claimants to first consult VA's Accreditation

Search Index to protect themselves from predatory practices."

A business or individual who prepares, presents or prosecutes VA benefit claims without proper recognition by the department is doing so contrary to law. All accredited representatives have been formally vetted to ensure they have good character and reputation along with being capable of providing competent representation for presenting to VA. When assisting Veterans, they must adhere to VA's standards of professional conduct which expressly prohibit the charging of unlawful or unreasonable fees. Those found in violation risk having their VA accreditation suspended or cancelled.

For more information on VA accredited representatives and their role, visit Accreditation & Discipline - Office of General Counsel to find information on VA-recognized VSOs and VA-accredited VSO representatives, attorneys and claims agents, fees for services and guidance on how to appoint and how to remove or change representation.

VFW Presses Congress on Comprehensive Toxic Reform 'Long Past Due'

WASHINGTON (March 18, 2021)

During the first ever all-virtual testimony to Congress, Veterans of Foreign Wars National Commander Hal Roesch called for the 117th Congress to get beyond partisan politics and work together to appropriately address toxic exposure during a special joint hearing of the House and Senate Committees on Veterans' Affairs held by video teleconference today.

The VFW delivered its top priority of toxic exposure reform, demanding Congress to develop a comprehensive solution for veterans who were exposed to toxic chemicals during their time in service. Roesch cited examples of toxic exposure throughout history, countering the notion that the claim is a new phenomenon.

"In World War I troops were exposed to gas, in World War II radiation, in Vietnam Agent Orange, in the Gulf War oil fires, and in Iraq and Afghanistan they were exposed to burn pits and other environmental hazards," Roesch said. "Toxic exposure for our troops has been synonymous with service for more than a hundred years, but every time we're faced with it, we act as if it's never happened before."

The VFW recommended Congress establish an independent commission, free of Department of Defense and Department of Veterans' Affairs (VA) oversight, as well as partner with the National Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine to identify toxic exposures and evaluate their association to certain diseases. They also stressed Congress obligate the VA to accept toxic exposure claims for the sake



veteran care.

"The VFW believes Congress should require VA to grant a presumption of service connection for the conditions deemed to be associated with toxic exposures and environmental hazards," said Roesch.

Roesch pointed to VFW testimony on the subject of Agent Orange in 1990. At the time, it was observed efforts to provide comprehensive benefits to veterans stalled due to the pursuit of 'scientific certainty.'

"To overcome this, Congress implemented a process for establishing a presumption of service connection based on a 'significant correlation' between exposure and the onset of disease," said Roesch. "Then, as now, we believe this represents a 'fair and compassionate solution' to a complex problem."

"We must create a framework that will take care of all past, present, and future generations of veterans; again, that is long overdue," said Roesch.

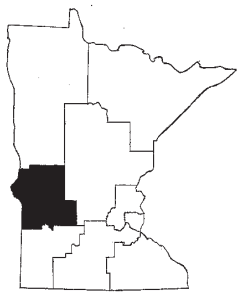
Hello to all,

Bees & Veterans



Bee Veterans 2021

The University of Minnesota Bee Squad’s Bee Veterans program (z.umn.edu/beeveteran) was founded in honor of beekeeper and Retired Lieutenant Colonel Michael Roche. His strong belief in the therapeutic benefits of beekeeping for returning Veterans inspires us to provide the materials and training necessary to make beekeeping an integral part of Veterans’ lives.

Over the years, we have met and mentored many Veterans and their family members. Two of those individuals, Josh Munoz and Christian Dahm, became Bee Veterans mentors themselves after participating in the training. Josh currently works as a Bee Veterans mentor at our Minneapolis location, and Christian founded and runs the Propolis Hive Company, which supplies hive boxes that encourage honey bees to collect and store medicinally-potent propolis.

Retired Lieutenant Colonel Roche’s interest and belief in the power of beekeeping is shared by Veterans across the country. This was confirmed for us at the American Beekeeping Federation’s annual conference, where Bee Squad led a conversation with beekeeper Veterans in 2020. Participants from all over the country talked about the positive impacts beekeeping had on their lives, and about the importance of sharing the experience of beekeeping with others.

This summer, we have a wonderful team of mentors preparing Bee Veterans classes. Assuming we are required to stay online, we will

be doing “live” apiary classes from the Bee Vets apiary, via Zoom!

- Workshops will be held on Zoom at 6:30pm on the third Thursday of the month from May-September, live from our Bee Veterans Apiary located at the MSP airport in Minneapolis: May 20th, June 23rd, July 15th, August 19th, September 16th.
- If COVID restrictions are lifted, we may offer “in person” classes along with the virtual option (dates will remain the same). There is no deadline for application for these “live from the apiary” classes.
- To participate, send an email to beesquad@umn.edu to be added to our email list and receive updates about Minneapolis Bee Veterans workshops offerings.
- Dependants of participating Veterans are welcome to join, too (spouses or children over the age of 18).

The Bee Squad is joining forces with Michigan State University’s Heroes to Hives program, along with University of Nebraska-Lincoln, and the University of Missouri. Through these partnerships, any Minnesota Veteran will be able to take advantage of Heroes to Hives’ nine month free online training, in addition to participating in hands-on, Minnesota-specific workshops throughout the beekeeping season (May through September).

but also made an impact on the National Organization. We have had two National Commanders-in-Chief: Robert E. Hansen (1961 – 1962) and John S. Staum (1985 – 1986).

Hansen gave new direction to the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He adopted what is now the Voice of Democracy Program. He put the Veterans of Foreign Wars on the Map with our U.S. Legislators and was not afraid to STAND Up for what was RIGHT for our Nation's Veterans. Bob was also the VFW Leader that established the VFW Cancer Research Center at the University of Minnesota. For Decades, a standing Tribute to the Department of Minnesota Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Staum stood firm on changes that had to be made at the National Veterans of Foreign Wars Headquarters. A sometimes quiet Leader – but TRUE in his Convictions. John also served on the Board of Directors for the National Korean War Memorial. MEMORIES(Past State Commanders – I could probably tell you a story about every State Commander since Robert E. Hansen):

- Past State Commander Bob Larson (then State Membership Chairman) walking across the stage at the 1977 VFW State Convention in Duluth every ten minutes with an alarm clock until the Department reached 100% in Membership.
- Past State Commander Pat Bohmer and his scantily dressed

ladies handing out Campaign Buttons at his Hospitality Room when he ran for State Judge Advocate. There are many stories about Pat... some cannot be shared.

- State Commander Kelly Ferber and his Membership Team(s) driving through Minnesota winter storms to pick up Membership.
- State Commander Merlin (Mo) Hanson riding the Caboose from Willmar to St. Paul and meeting John O'Neill at the Depot to take care of Department business.
- State Commander Paul Reuter flying by Private airplane from International Falls to the St. Paul Airport to meet John O'Neill to conduct Department business.
- Past State Commander Al Loehr and his Legislative knowledge. Loehr seemed to know every Legislator by their first name. He always had the ability to get Legislation passed that benefited our Veterans.
- Past State Commander Jimmy Connolly sitting in Senator Paul Wellstone's Washington Office and saying to Senator Wellstone, "We voted you in, we can take you out!" Jimmy always spoke his mind.
- Past State Commander Frank Volk collapsing and passing away on the Midwinter Council of Administration table, just after he defended the Veterans on the Lake Trust Fund (his Commander's Project). God Bless you Frank...

Obviously, there are many more stories about our Past State Commanders. Many of which can and should be shared with the Membership (some stories, should just stay in the box they are buried in). Maybe some of these stories will come out in later issues of the Gopher Oversea'r.


Before, I close off this article, I would like to visit something I opened with.... Mentoring! We have (or it would appear) lost our ability to Mentor the members of our Posts, Districts and even the Department. Pick out a New Veteran, tell him/her about the Veterans of Foreign Wars and don't just leave it at that. Make sure that you make them a part of everything that the Veterans of Foreign Wars has been and is doing. Be there to Mentor them. An article about writing post websites, in the last Gopher Oversea'r, resulted in several questions and comments. To clarify, almost anyone can write a post website. It is not difficult. The goal is to present the organization in a positive light to members and the public. Websites are information resources. They can be a force for good or can give the post a black eye if the content is outdated.

An important point is the web address needs to be short. In the case of the one I write for the Brainerd VFW, it is *BrainerdVFW.org*. The address does not have a post number or even say post. It is short and to the point, so it is easy to relate in a

conversation and be remembered.

You will note also that the address ends in *.org* and not *.com*. National VFW and state/department VFW websites end in *.org* because VFWs are not-for-profit organizations and are taxed accordingly. Interestingly, the Brainerd VFW has a *.com* address as well. The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States was the first organization to promote a nationwide distribution of Poppies made by disabled veterans.

The Poppy has become traditional as the Memorial Day flower and as the symbol of remembrance for military members who have lost their lives or their health in the defense of their country. Its significance has spread throughout the world. A distribution of artificial Poppies is conducted throughout the British Commonwealth and in many countries of Europe.

Through the national distribution of Poppies, millions of dollars are raised annually for the support of ten VFW National Home for Children in Eaton Rapids, Michigan and for the rehabilitation services for disabled veterans. Annually, over a million dollars have been provided for local relief programs throughout the nation.

It is important to note that since the Veterans of Foreign Wars holds a trademark on the “Buddy” Poppy, they are able to guarantee that all poppies that bear the name and the VFW label are genuine products made by disabled and needy

veterans. The name “Buddy” Poppy cannot legally be used by any other individual or organization.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars is especially proud that its poppy distributions are conducted strictly and entirely by volunteers. No poppy workers are paid for their work. Their recompense comes from a sense of pride in helping the less fortunate.

About 100,000 volunteers aid in the distribution of poppies each year in the United States; at least 6,000 of them in Minnesota alone.

Although we emphasize Buddy Poppies on Memorial Day and Veterans Day, it is important to realize that the distribution of Buddy Poppies should be a year-round exercise. Each time a Post participates in an activity where the public will be present, Buddy Poppies should be present as a fund raising tool and simply to recognize our fallen comrades. Where the VFW appears, Buddy Poppies should be a constant reminder that we will never forget those who have perished in the name of liberty. Just as “They gave, Will You?” is a year-round thing, so should the distribution of VFW “Buddy” Poppies.

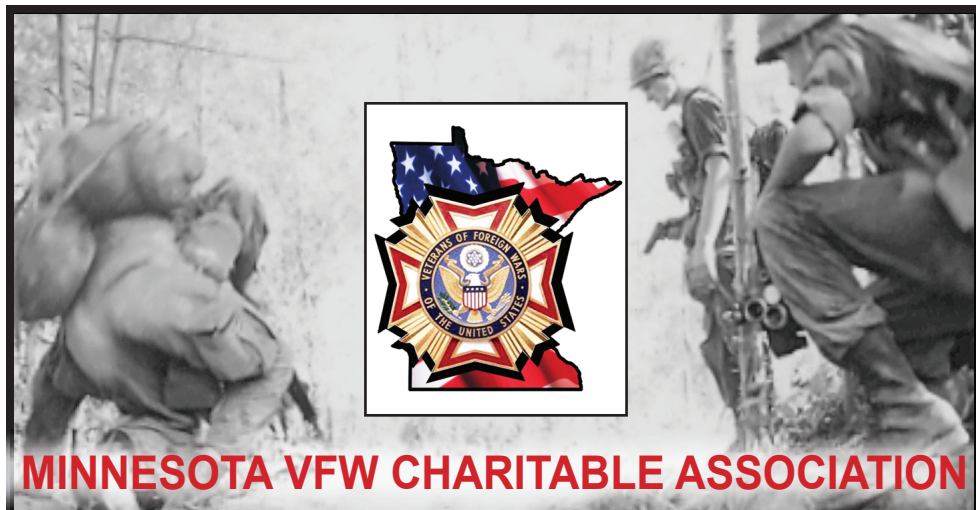
