

Every military installation flies the National League of Families' POW/MIA flag in remembrance of the 83,000 Americans who remain missing.

Thousands of VFW and Auxiliary delegates gathered at the Phoenix Convention Center in Phoenix, AZ July 22-27. They represent the organization's more than 1.5 million combined membership at the week long VFW National Convention. While there, the delegates approved new national priorities to guide our organization as we lobby Congress on issues important to the nation's veterans, service members and their families.

"Nothing makes me prouder than to have my home state host our national convention," said VFW National Commander Tim Borland, who is a Gold Legacy Life member of VFW Post 9972 in Sierra Vista, Arizona. "For the past two years, we held our convention close to our national headquarters in Kansas City, Missouri. It feels good to travel across this great land, celebrate all our accomplishments over this past year and remind all of us that every veteran counts.

In addition to remarks from VA Secretary Denis McDonough, this year's list of guest speakers included: USAACEO Wayne Peacock; Twisted X CEO Prasad Reddy; vice minister of the Taiwanese Veterans Affairs Council Wu, Chih-Yang; Deputy Director POW/MIA Accounting Agency Fern Sumpter Winbush and former Senior Enlisted Advisor to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs and VFW National Ambassador SEAC (Ret.) John Wayne Troxell.

Numerous prominent individuals and organizations were recognized for their support of the veteran and military communities. Several Distinguished Service Award and VFW Gold Medal of Merit were presented including the VFW Distinguished Citizenship Award. This was awarded to celebrity Chef Robert Irvine, the first non-veteran to receive the honor

### Treasurer/Secretary Chair

Greetings everyone

If your VFW Auxiliary has elected a new Treasurer, please make sure you send form 8822B to the IRS. This form lets the IRS know there has been a change in the "responsible party" for your VFW Auxiliary. The form is available in MALTA under the Duties tab in the Treasurer Resources section. You should also fill out this form if your Treasurer has a change in name, address, etc.

It is not necessary to send a copy of your bond to the Department Office if you are bonding through the National Organization... only when using an outside company is it necessary for you to send a copy of your bond to the Department Office. Bonds purchased from a source other than National require Council approval. Bonds must be purchased in the amount of DOUBLE the amount of your Auxiliary assets. Bonds must be purchased no later than August 31, 2023.

990N e-postcards are due by November 15. A copy of your acceptance is needed in the Department VFW Auxiliary HQ Office. If your auxiliary files a tax return, you do not need to complete the 990N, but we need a copy of your return on file in place of the

990N. YOU DO NOT HAVE TO PAY ANYTHING TO FILE THE 990N ONLINE! If you are trying to complete the 990N e-postcard online and someone is trying to charge you a fee to do it.... you are on the wrong website! We are unable to file the 990N for individual auxiliaries. This is the sole responsibility of the

We are receiving far too many Membership Applications that have to be returned. Please make sure that before you send any application to the office for processing you have it filled out completely. The most common problems we encounter are:

- Missing Signatures either the applicant or the Investigating Committee.
- 2. Eligibility—this must be complete or it will not be processed. Assure the VFW Membership number is included if they are affiliated if they are unaffiliated, you must have the dates served, the location served (foreign) and the qualifying medals of the veteran.
- Missing DOB (date of birth)
- Missing Phone number 4.
- 5. Missing or incorrect VFW Auxiliary number that they are joining.
- 6. Incorrect funds or no funds sent.

### **VFW** asks **SECDEF** to Award new AF **Expeditionary Medals**

July 17, 2023

WASHINGTON With President Joe Biden's executive order issued July 14, approving the mobilization of select reservists of the Armed Forces to active duty to support Operation Atlantic Resolve, Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) National Commander Tim Borland is renewing his call for the Department of Defense to award the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal to those service members deployed to defend NATO's eastern flank.

"Operation Atlantic Resolve is now a named contingency operation and the troops directly supporting this crucial mission deserve proper recognition," said Borland. "The Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal was created for just this reason."

First authorized by Executive Order 10977 signed by President John F. Kennedy in 1961, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal is awarded for participations in U.S. military operations, operations in direct support of the United Nations and for U.S. operations of assistance to friendly foreign nations. The DOD previously approved 36 operations eligible for the award. The characteristics of the various operations include assurance, deterrence, peacekeeping, and reinforcement in support of allies, including ongoing NATO operations in former Yugoslavia.

During a Pentagon press briefing on July 13, DOD News reported Joint Staff Director of Operations Lt. Gen. Douglas A. Sims II said Operation Atlantic Resolve is designated as a contingency operation. According to Title 10, the definition of the term

"contingency operation" is "a military operation that is designated by the Secretary of Defense as an operation in which members of the Armed Forces are or may become involved in military actions, operations, or hostilities against an enemy of the United States or against an opposing military force."

"This new designation benefits troops and families with increases in authorities, entitlements and access to the reserve component forces and personnel," said Sims.

"By exercising his authority with this simple, yet meaningful gesture," said Borland, "Secretary of Defense Austin has the opportunity to show U.S. service members how much he appreciates what they are doing to support our NATO allies in eastern Europe."

During Congressional testimony in March, Borland first addressed the need to recognize service members serving in eastern Europe to support NATO after Russia's invasion of Ukraine. Borland observed the need for proper recognition after visiting American troops serving in Poland in February. He said that the global security situation demanded that U.S. service members be quickly sent to the defense of NATO allies, and recognizing those serving in a forward operational capacity with a medal is the right thing to do.

"The VFW calls on the DOD and Congress to properly recognize the immense contributions of those who served and are serving on the eastern flank of NATO by awarding them the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal for deterring Russian aggression," said Borland.

### **VA Launches Nat'l PACT Act Summer VetFest**

WASHINGTON — In July, VA will kick off PACT Act Summer VetFest to inform Veterans, their families, and survivors about the PACT Act and encourage them to apply for the health care and benefits they have earned. The PACT Act, which President Biden signed into law on Aug. 10, 2022, is the biggest expansion of Veteran health care and benefits in generations.

Throughout July, VA will host 50+ Summer VetFest events across all 50 states, DC, and Puerto Rico. The events will be casual summer gatherings featuring Veterans, their families, Veteran advocates, and the VA health care and benefits professionals who serve them. At the events, VA staff will be ready to help Veterans apply for PACT Act-related benefits (or submit an intent to file), enroll in VA health care, get screened for toxic exposures, and more.

VA encourages all eligible Veterans and survivors to file a claim — or submit their intent to file a claim — for PACT Act-related outreach campaign, which granted, backdated to Aug. 10, 2022, the day that President Biden signed the bill into law.

and survivors across America who are eligible for new health care and benefits, and we will not rest until every one of them gets what they've earned," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "That's what this Summer VetFest is all about: educating Veterans, their families, and survivors — and encouraging them to apply today."

Since President Biden signed the PACT Act into law, VA has delivered more than \$1.4 billion in PACT Act benefits to Veterans. Additionally, more than 665,000 Veterans have applied for PACT Act-related benefits, more than 3.7 million Veterans have received the new toxic exposure screenings, and more than 287,000 Veterans have enrolled in VA health care (this is 40,000 more enrollments than during the same timeframe last year, and it includes 94,000 enrollees from the PACT Act target population).

The PACT Act Summer VetFest is just one component of VA's nationwide PACT Act Veteran benefits now. Veterans who do so by the largest coordinated outreach Aug. 9 may have their benefits, if campaign in VA history. The campaign has one goal: ensuring that every eligible Veteran and survivor gets the PACT Act-related health "There are millions of Veterans care and benefits they have earned.

115th Commander-in-Chief.

Sarmiento, who is of mixed Filipino and Italian heritage, is the first person of color elected to lead the 124-year-old organization. He has served in elected and appointed position at the post, district and department levels culminating in being elected as Department of New Jersey Commander from 2018-2019. A retired township police officer, Sarmiento is also a member of the Delaware Military Order of the Cooties, Ky-Yi Pup Tent #1.

His remarks were delivered to those attending in person at the Phoenix Convention Center as well as those watching via livestreaming video.

During his acceptance speech Sarmiento said, "Today, I humbly stand here as a testament to the limitless potential of our great nation and a product of the American dream. As a kid from New Jersey, I never imagined I would be standing here to accept such a prestigious position in one of the most prestigious institutions in our country."

Sarmiento joined the VFW in 1990 at Post 5579 in Gibbstown, New Jersey, where he maintains his Gold Legacy Life membership. He has served in elected and appointed positions at the Post, District and Department levels, culminating with his election as the VFW Department of New Jersey Commander from 2018 to 2019. Nationally, he served as the VFW Inspector General from 2019 to 2020, as well as on several national committees,

Inclosing, he said, "Regardless of your pecking order in this organization, keep this in mind – you don't need a title to lead. You just need to care. People would rather follow a leader with a heart than a leader with a title."

### Fort Snelling National Cemetery Carillon

The existing veteran's carillon at Fort Snelling National Cemetery was commemorated in 1986, but has been silent over 20 years due to an excavation error in 2003.

Currently there are over 210,000 veterans buried at Fort Snelling, and their tombstones remain a lasting symbol of the cost of freedom. Additionally, over 200,000 visitors visit the cemetery annually.

The Fort Snelling Carillon is one of 93 carillons at American Cemeteries in the US, Europe, North Africa and the Pacific. It was installed in 1986 as part of the AMVETS Carillon Program (https://amvetsnsf.org/carillon/).

American Legion Post 580, Chanhassen, MN volunteered and was vetted by the Department of Veterans Affairs on February 13, 2023 to initiate a fund-raising project for repairs to the existing carillon. On May 19, 2023 *Minnesota Veterans 4 Veterans* (a 501c19 organization) established an account for all carillon donations. This organization and account satisfy the gambling commission requirements for receiving gambling funds as a donation.

The carillon system will include new speakers for the existing carillon tower; underground speaker conduit from the administration building to the tower; a digital control system; and office installation. The total funds necessary for this effort are approximately \$90,000. All funds raised will be solely for the new carillon and will be utilized only when the mission amount is raised. Any amounts raised but not used will be returned to American Legion Post 580 for philanthropic use.

It is estimated that in the next twenty years, 4 million loved ones



and visitors will once again hear the carillon playing inspirational, reverent, and patriotic music honoring the veterans' service to our country.



There is a change in the way to report Community Service. Starting this membership year all Community Service Reports (CSR) must be entered on the All-American Dashboard. The following have been authorized to submit entries on the All-American Dashboard: Post Cmdrs., Sr. Vice Cmdrs., Jr. Vice Cmdrs., Quartermasters and Adjutants.

The CSR is a joint report between Posts and their Auxiliaries. Auxiliaries will not have access to the All-American Dashboard. If your Post has an Auxiliary, the Auxiliary will need to submit their Community Service to an officer of their post who will be in charge on entering Community Service on the All-American Dashboard.

The August issue of the Department General Orders included detailed instructions on how to enter information to the CSR on the Dashboard.


If you need assistance please contact me.

### Behind the Lines with Code Talkers

Harry Meyer was born on a farm in 1926, a few years before his family moved to Red Lake Falls, MN. At the age of 13, he took an interest in building radios. He enjoyed playing music on the radio (AM band) to his friends until he was visited by two Federal Communications Commission Inspectors who confiscated his equipment. Apparently, his signal managed to traveled all the way to Oklahoma, as AM signals do at night. He was causing interference on a local licensed radio broadcast station.

When the US entered WWII, Harry signed up at the age of 17. He was shipped off to the Naval Training Station in Farragut, ID and then sent to Long Beach, CA, because he had "radio aptitude." While there, he learned Morse Code and radio maintenance.

Only 12 or

Only 12 out of 40 who started in his class finished the course. After returning from leave one day, he found a note telling him to report to the Dana Point Marine Base.

There, Harry learned to provide radio communications for a bunch of Marines from New Mexico and Arizona - the Navajo Code Talkers. Then it was off to Hawaii by ship. Issued a camouflage uniform, he was paired with a Code Talker and sent off to Japanese held islands.

They would sneak ashore on islands like Okinawa. They had to evade Japanese to get close-up visuals on potential targets before invasions and also to call in artillery strikes later. They stealthily traveled on foot thru the jungle to avoid Japanese.


Before the atomic bombs were dropped on Japan, he was undergoing training for surveillance missions to Japan.

After the war, Harry was sent to Guam to update the communications systems, which are still in use today.

When released from active duty in 1946, he went back to finish his high school education.

His communications experience got him a job at Northwestern Bell/AT&T (the phone company back then). He spent 40 years maintaining microwave communications towers from the Canadian border to the Twin Cities with Brainerd in the middle.

Now he is a resident at the



Northern Lakes Senior Living facility in Baxter where residents love to hear stories from his excellent memory.

A VFW life member, Harry served two years as Commander of St. Cloud, MN, East Side VFW Post 4847 in the 1960's. He still attends local veteran events at Brainerd VFW Post 1647.
